PRINTING

The majority of our downloads are formatted to print on 8.5x11” paper unless otherwise noted. You may print at home or a local print shop. We recommend using a recent version of Adobe Acrobat PDF Reader to view and print your files. It is available for free online. If you run into problems with pages being cut off, select “fit to page” in your print dialogue box to make sure it fits on your page correctly.

To print large page sizes (anything larger than 8.5x11”), we recommend going to a local print shop like Kinko’s, Staples, AlphaGraphics, etc. and ask them to print your file as a black and white “engineer print” or “blueprint.” These larger prints are big, fun and fairly inexpensive.

If the staff at your print shop asks you about your rights to reproduce this work, you will find a copyright release below. Or you can tell them you downloaded these files for personal use from comefollowmefhe.com and they can look us up to see if you do have the rights to print the copies.

GO & DO Family Activity

Jesus Christ is the chief cornerstone of our church.

Ephesians 2:20

As a family, read Ephesians 2:20 and the 6th paragraph of The Restoration Proclamation with your family. Point out the words “chief cornerstone.” Discuss with your family what a cornerstone is and how Jesus Christ is the “chief cornerstone” of our church.

“Facts about the Cornerstone”

What it is: A cornerstone is the first stone placed upon a building’s foundation, in a corner of the structure.

What it does: A cornerstone bears much of the weight of a building’s outer structure, and it connects and unites two of the walls. After it is placed, all other stones and their angles are measured out from it.

What its characteristics are: Anciently, a cornerstone would normally be one of the largest, most solid stones a builder had to work with. The builder would examine his stones carefully and select the best one as a cornerstone, rejecting any stones that didn’t appear suitable. (Ensign, January 2016)
